In addition, there is a session focusing on methods to advocate for your expanded role within your workplace and resources to assist you to negotiate this process.

The workshop, coordinated by ASHM, has been developed through collaboration between the NSW STI Programs Unit, APNA and ASHHNA. ASHM is an APNA Endorsed Provider Partner, allowing you to claim APNA CPD hours for attending.

This is a free course for NSW nurses. The cost for the course for non-NSW participants is \$250 (ASHM members) or \$280 (non-ASHM members). Priority to attend the course will be given to NSW nurses.
